**ITEMS SENT TO RECREATION COMMITTEE**

Commissioner Herring requested the Recreation Committee to look at doing something for the youth similar to Alive After Five.

Commissioner Powell noted he had attended the Granville Interdenominational Ministerial Conference and he was asked why the City was not moving towards investing in a recreational facility. He referred this item to the Recreation Committee in order to get the process moving towards a recreational facility.

Commissioner Powell also requested the City look at creating an Office of Youth Initiatives that would deal with positive things for youth. He requested creating a paid position for the upcoming budget year and recommended looking at a bond to fund this venture. The Recreation Committee is to look at this request.

Mayor Woodlief recognized the senior center has gone to the County requesting a recreational facility and were turned down. He noted they have founded the Senior Citizens Federation and noted it may take a countywide bond to make a recreational facility happen. He stressed it is a real need for both young and old. Commissioner Powell noted in Washington, DC a recreational facility was placed in one of the worse communities in DC and it has elevated the community. Commissioner Shope echoed Mayor Woodlief by noting the seniors are a growing population and the facility needs to lean towards the young and old.
