OXFORD BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AGENDA SESSION

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Oxford met at the above-mentioned time and place to set the agenda for the regular meeting to be held August 11, 2009 at 7:00 p.m. at City Hall, 300 Williamsboro Street.

Present were: Mayor Al Woodlief, Jr., Mayor Pro Tem Howard Herring, Sr., Commissioners Robert Shope, Paul F. Kiesow, Steve Powell, Robert B. Williford, Sr., and Walter Cantley. Present also were City Manager Mark Donham, City Clerk Donna B. Hosch, and City Attorney Thomas Burnette. Absent was Commissioner A. Chance Wilkinson.

AGENDA SET

The Board set the agenda for the August 11, 2009 regular session.

ADDITIONS/COMMENTS

Mayor Pro Tem Herring gave praise to Dennis Wilson, Superintendent for the Wastewater Treatment Plant, and his staff for the article in tpo (treatment plant operator) magazine. Wilson is the cover story for the August 2009 edition, and MPT Herring stated a “warm fuzzy” should be given to Wilson by the City for his accomplishments.

MPT Herring asked if there is a statute or other tool in place to address cut grass being blown into and left in the streets. Many times there is no effort made to clean up the grass. City Manager Donham stated this is an aesthetic issue. In addition, the grass clippings get into the drainage system. MPT Herring stated he wished some type of program started which would address this issue; CM Donham stated he would look into the matter.

MPT Herring stated the right of way on Lewis Street is overgrown and looks terrible. It was mentioned that this is a State road and that the State recently cleaned the ROW up to Two Sisters restaurant. Commissioner Williford stated that a portion of Williamsboro Street is grown up. Again, it was stated that this is a State road but that the City will look into having

the areas cut. CM Donham informed the Board that some other states are not cutting ROWs as often due to a lack of funding.

With there being no further business, MPT Herring made a motion to adjourn. All votes were in the affirmative.
