**CALL TO ORDER**

Discussion on 4D Mayor Sergent asked about the impact on the neighbors. Commissioner Currin mentioned the the Public Hearing wasn't until September so there would be time to get more information on this project.

Commissioner Tovey gave an update on the dog that started all the discussion on the tethering ordinance. He now has a large fenced in yard and is off the chain and has a new doghouse.

Commissioner Bridges stated that citizens are asking about the round-a-bout being lopsided. City Manager Thornton said that they have poured concrete and it does look different.

Commissioner Currin stated that he had read about a 10 million dollar loan for revitalization and that the worse looking building in the downtown is the Granville County Inspection building. Can't we get the County to do something about it? City Manager Thornton said the the City Commissioners needs to discuss this with the County Commissioners.

Commissioner Fields stated that the County anniversary event and how much she enjoyed it.

Commissioner Bullock asked about the problems with the Downtown traffic lights? Can we get DOT to take a look at them?
